OUR STUDENTS

Ogeechee Technical College enrolled 2,901 students in credit courses during Academic Year 2023.

This was the full-time equivalent (FTE) of 1,521 students (based on the sum of total credit hours for all students). The College's Student Retention Rate is 66.0% of first-time, regular-admitted students enrolled in Fall 2021, who graduated or were still enrolled in a Georgia college/university or National Clearinghouse college as of the end of the next year (AY 23).




An unduplicated total of 790 graduates received awards from OTC in AY 2023.


